ANNUAL REPORT FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2013

Submitted to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor March 3, 2014



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INTRODUCTION

The Alaska Workers' Compensation Appeals Commission (Commission) is charged with providing fair, prompt, and thoughtful adjudication of appeals from decisions by the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board (Board). An appeal to the Commission is а formal administrative appeal and appeal decisions must be published. The Commission is committed to ensuring that "hearings in workers' compensation cases shall be impartial and fair to all parties and that all parties shall be afforded due process and an opportunity to be heard and for their arguments and evidence to be fairly considered." AS 23.30.001(4).

Figure 1 in the next column illustrates the place of the Commission in the workers' compensation adjudication system.

The Commission chair has certain duties prescribed by law. One of the chair's duties is to make available to the public, and to file with the office of the lieutenant governor, a report regarding the Commission's activity for the prior calendar year, including data regarding time periods between initial receipt and final decisions on appeals, not later than March 15th of each year. This report is filed to satisfy that duty.

Under workers' compensation law, the **Alaska Supreme Court** (supreme court) hears appeals from decisions by the Commission. The supreme court decides all questions of law, including constitutionality of statutes and the validity and constitutionality of regulations.

The Alaska Workers' Compensation Appeals Commission hears appeals from decisions by the Board. There are five appeals commissioners: two appeals commissioners are employee representatives and two are employer representatives. The chair is an attorney. An appeal must be heard by one employee commissioner, one employer commissioner, and the chair. Commission decisions bind the Commission itself and all Board panels to a uniform interpretation of workers' compensation law. The Commission must follow supreme court rulings. Appeals are decided on the Board's record and arguments presented by the parties. Commissioners use independent judgment on law and procedure, but do not reweigh facts. The Commission is in the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, but is independent of the Division of Workers' Compensation.

The Division of Workers' Compensation (Division) has offices in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau, where parties can obtain information, file a claim or petition with the Board, and attend Board hearings. The Division also collects data. enforces reporting, reviews self-insurance certificates, and manages both the Workers' Compensation Benefits Guaranty Fund, the Fishermen's Fund, and the Second Injury Fund. The Division provides needed administrative support to the Board. Division sections. and the Commission.

The *Adjudications Section's* hearing officers, pre-hearing officers, and clerks assist the Board to hear, mediate, and decide cases.

The Special Investigations Unit investigates and prosecutes fraud and uninsured employers before the Board.

The *Director* may intervene in appeals.

The Alaska Workers' Compensation Board hears claims and petitions by injured workers, employers, and Division investigators. The Board panels conduct hearings of many kinds and approve settlements. The Board consists of nine industry members, nine labor members, and the Commissioner of the Department of Labor, who is the chair. Board members are appointed to three-year terms. The Board hears cases in three-member panels (one labor member, one industry member, and one hearing officer), but may hear a case with a quorum of two (a representative member and a hearing officer). Each Board panel is independent, but must follow Commission and supreme court rulings. The Board as a whole body approves regulations adopted by the Division.

COMMISSION MEMBERS

The Commission consists of five members: four representative members and the chair. Each representative member must have at least 18 months of experience as a member of the Board. Two members represent employees and two represent employers. The chair must be an attorney who has been engaged in the active practice of law for at least five years in Alaska with experience in workers' compensation law in this state.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge in the Office of Administrative Hearings announces and reviews the applications for each vacancy on the Commission and forwards a list of qualified nominees to the Governor for appointment. The Alaska State Legislature must confirm appointees.

The commissioners' five-year terms are staggered so a seat on the Commission falls vacant every year. Because every appeal is heard by a full, balanced panel, and panelists may not hear cases if they have a connection with a party, avoiding vacancies is a concern of the Commission.

The members of the Commission are, in order of expiration of term:

Laurence P. Keyes, chair, of Anchorage, was appointed to a five-year term as the chair of the Commission by Governor Sean Parnell on February 2, 2010, and took office on March 1, 2010. He has practiced law in Kodiak and Anchorage since 1982. Since 1990, he has specialized in litigation of bodily injury and property damage claims, including workers' compensation claims. He also served as an arbitrator of personal injury claims and as an adjunct professor at the University of Alaska Anchorage Justice Center, lecturing in Maritime and Fisheries Law. He received his LL.M. in maritime law from the University of London in 1988, his J.D. *magna cum laude* from Gonzaga University in 1981, and his B.A. in philosophy from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1970. **His term expires on March 1, 2015**.

James N. Rhodes, an employee representative, of Ketchikan, is an 18year member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Union Local 1547. He served as a member for labor on the Board from August 2001 until March 2005. He was appointed by Governor Sean Parnell to complete a four-year term as commissioner in 2012. His term expires on March 1, 2016.

S. т. Hagedorn, employer an representative, of Anchorage, retired from the Alaska Railroad Corporation in June 2009 after a 34-year career, with the last 24 years as Corporate Risk He was appointed as a Manager. member for industry to the Board in 1991 by Governor Walter Hickel, reappointed twice by Governor Tony Knowles, and reappointed in 2006 by Governor Frank Murkowski (15 years of Board service). He has a B.A. in history from the University of Northern Iowa. He was appointed by Governor Sarah Palin to a five-year term as commissioner in March 2007, and reappointed by Governor Sean Parnell to another fiveyear term in February 2012. His term expires on March 1, 2017.

David W. Richards, an employee representative, of Eagle River, is a

retired member of Carpenters' Union Local 2247 and a current member of Laborers' Local 341. He served as a member for labor on the Board in Juneau until 1991. He was appointed by Governor Sarah Palin to a five-year term as commissioner in March 2008 and reappointed by Governor Sean Parnell to a five-year term in February 2013. **His term expires on March 1, 2018**.


Philip Ε. Ulmer, an employer representative, of Eagle River, is a Workers' Certified Compensation Professional, currently employed as Sr. Manager of Safety and Workers' Compensation for GCI. He is a previous national president of the American Society of Safety Engineers and of the National Institute for Engineering Ethics, and a 1994 Engineer of the Year finalist with the Alaska Society of Professional Engineers. He served as a member for industry on the Board. He was appointed by Governor Frank Murkowski to a four-year term as commissioner in November 2005, reappointed bv Governor Sarah Palin to a five-year term in March 2009, and reappointed by Governor Sean Parnell to a five-year term in March 2014. His term expires on March 1, 2019.

COMMISSION CASES

Cases Filed in 2013


The Commission docketed 26 new cases in calendar year (CY) 2013. Figure 2 shows the types of cases filed in 2013.

There is substantial seasonal variation in the filing of appeals and petitions for review, as shown in Figure 3.

2013 Commission Docket

In addition to the 26 new cases docketed in 2013, the Commission began 2013 with 18 cases on its docket: one filed in CY 2010, three filed in CY 2011, and 14 filed in CY 2012.

At the end of 2013, the Commission had 15 cases on its docket: one filed in CY 2010 and 14 filed in 2013. One case on the docket at the beginning of 2013 was still on the docket at the end of 2013, due to a pending case before the superior court regarding appointment of a guardian *ad litem* for a selfrepresented appellant.

Figure 4 shows the number of open cases on the Commission docket at the end of each month, the number of new cases filed each month, and other types of production in 2013.

Appendix A is the Commission's complete 2013 docket, which also includes cases from prior years that were appealed or petitioned for review to the supreme court, and contains notes on the status of those cases.

Oral Arguments, Hearings, and Orders

The Commission held a total of 13 hearings in 2013 – seven oral arguments on appeal, two oral arguments on petitions for review, and four hearings on motions for stays. Some appeal

participants did not request oral argument.

The Commission issued orders on such motions regarding issues as extensions of time to file appeals, stays pending appeal, dismissals, waivers of filing fees and/or transcription costs due to indigence, attorney fees, clarification, reconsideration, suspension of appeal proceedings, and orders granting or denying petitions for review. The Commission chair issued orders on motions for extensions of time to file briefs, notices of default with orders to comply, and similar procedural matters. In 2013, the Commission issued 94 unpublished orders, an 18% decrease from CY 2012.

Average Time Period for Cases Closed in 2013

In addition to the 18 cases that were on the docket at the beginning of 2013 and the 26 new cases that were filed in 2013, one CY 2011 case was reopened on the 2013 docket due to a supreme court appeal that was remanded to the Commission for further proceedings. Taken together, a total of 45 cases appeared on the 2013 Commission docket (Appendix A).

Of the 45 cases that appeared on the 2013 docket, 30 cases were closed in 2013. This resulted in a closure rate of 67% of the cases that appeared on the 2013 docket, the same rate as in CY 2012. The average time period from the date of filing to the date of closure for those 30 cases was 204 days.

Of the 26 cases filed in 2013, 12 were also closed in 2013, resulting in a closure rate of 46% for cases filed and closed in 2013. This is a decrease of 6%

compared to CY 2012. The average time period from the date of filing to the date of closure for cases that were filed and closed in 2013 was 105 days.

Resolution of Cases in 2013

Thirty cases that were on the 2013 docket were closed. Eleven resulted in decisions on the merits appeals; one resulted in both a decision on the merits of an appeal and a decision on reconsideration; three resulted in decisions on petitions for review; and, two resulted in decisions on remand from the supreme court. Seven cases were closed due to settlement; one was dismissed voluntarily; four were petitions for review that were denied; and one was a motion for reconsideration that was denied (Appendix A).

Indigent Participants

In 2013, the Commission granted two of three motions to waive payment of a filing fee due to indigence. There were three motions for waiver of payment of transcript costs due to indigence: one was granted and two were partially granted. In 2013, the Commission paid a total of \$2,924.50 to have Board hearings transcribed for indiaent employees. Of that amount, \$985.00 was for two CY 2012 cases where waivers were granted at the end of CY 2012 and costs were paid in 2013.


Attorney Representation

Unrepresented employees filed seven of the 26 new cases in 2013. In the cases filed by unrepresented employees, all the opposing parties were represented by an attorney. Six cases were filed by represented employees with all of the opposing parties being represented.

Employers filed 12 cases, with two of those were filed by unrepresented employers. In all but two of those 12 cases, all of the opposing parties were represented; one had an unrepresented, non-participating service provider; and, one had an unrepresented employee. One case was filed by the Workers' Compensation Benefits Guaranty Fund, which was represented, and the employee was represented, but the unrepresented, uninsured employer did not participate.

Figure 5 compares unrepresented participants to represented participants. When compared to CY 2012, the number filed unrepresented of cases by employees decreased by six, cases filed by represented employees increased by cases filed by represented three, employers decreased by two, and cases filed by unrepresented employers increased by one.

COMMISSION DECISIONS

Published Decisions

In 2013, 17 Commission decisions were published. Twelve were on the merits of an appeal, one was on reconsideration, one was on remand from the supreme court, and three were decisions on petitions for review. Appendix B is a list of the Commission's 2013 published decisions, with notes on the number of days to decision and whether the decision was appealed or petitioned for review to the supreme court.

The average time from oral argument (or record closure if oral argument was not requested) to the issuance of a decision in 2013 was 33 days, well within the statutory allowance of 90 days.

Time Period between Initial Receipt and Decision on Appeal

As shown in Appendix B, the average time period between the initial receipt of an appeal and the issuance of a decision on the merits for cases on the 2013 docket, was 315 days. This is an average of 46 fewer days than CY 2012.

Published Decisions – Case Resolution

The results of Commission decisions published in 2013 are summarized in Appendix B. In nine decisions on the merits of an appeal, the Commission affirmed the Board's decision (one being on remand from the supreme court). One decision the Commission reversed in part, vacated in part, and remanded to the Board; one decision the Commission affirmed in part, and vacated and remanded in part; one decision the Commission reversed in part and reversed and remanded in part; and, two decisions the Commission reversed, vacated, and remanded to the Board (one was on reconsideration).

The Commission issued three decisions on petitions for review of interlocutory decisions in 2013. The Commission does not consider the

granting or denial of a petition for review to be a decision on the merits of the challenged Board decision. Of the three decisions on petitions for review that were issued, one decision reversed the Board's decision; one reversed and remanded to the Board; and, one reversed in part and affirmed in part the Board's decision.

SUPREME COURT ACTION

In 2013, four Commission decisions or orders were appealed to the supreme court. One was dismissed, leaving three 2013 Commission decisions or orders awaiting a supreme court ruling.

Three Commission decisions on petitions for review were petitioned for review to the supreme court and are awaiting decisions.

In 2013, three Commission orders where petitioned for review to the supreme court; two were denied, and one was granted and awaits a supreme court ruling.

A total of 10 Commission decisions or orders presently await a supreme court ruling: two issued in CY 2011; one issued in CY 2012; and, seven issued in 2013. See Appendix A to see which decisions or orders await supreme court rulings.

In 2013, the supreme court decided six appeals of Commission decisions.

The supreme court issued an opinion in 2013 on an appeal filed in 2010, *Pruitt vs. Providence Extended Care*, 297 P.3d 891, which affirmed the Commission's decision, which affirmed the Board's decision.

The supreme court issued an opinion in 2013 on another appeal filed in 2010,

ARCTEC Services vs. Cummings, 295 P.3d 916, affirming the Commission's decision, which affirmed the Board's decision.

The supreme court issued an opinion in 2013 on an appeal filed in 2011, *Sosa de Rosario vs. Chenega Lodging*, 297 P.3d 139, reversing the Commission's decision and remanding to the Commission with instructions to reinstate the board's order.

The supreme court issued an opinion in 2013 on another appeal filed in 2011, *Rosales vs. Icicle Seafoods, Inc.*, 316 P.3d 580, affirming the Commission's decision, which affirmed the Board's decision.

The supreme court issued an opinion in 2013 on an order denying stay of future benefits issued in 2012, *Municipality of Anchorage v. Adamson,* 301 P.3d 569, affirming the commission's order.

In 2013, the supreme court issued Memorandum Opinion and Judgment No. 1466 on an appeal filed in 2010, *Milton vs. UIC Construction*, affirming the Commission's decision, which affirmed the Board's decision.

REGULATION CHANGES

No changes were made to the Commission's regulations during 2013.
